**6. REQUEST FROM SWALE BOROUGH TO NAME NEW ROAD**

The Town Council considered the request from Swale Borough Council to name the new road on the site adjacent to 9 Ashford Road/Canterbury Road Orchard Walk. Following a discussion the Town Council agreed to put forward the name **Marchant Grove** as an alternative.

Simon Marchant: a native of Faversham. He gained an MA at Oxford University. Ordained in Faversham Parish Church, he became Rector of Preston in 1290. Marchant was appointed to other prestigious posts,

including at Hereford Cathedral, and became Chancellor of Oxford University in 1303, remaining Rector of Preston. He was nominated to be Archdeacon of Canterbury, but met an untimely death at Avignon, France.

### **PUBLIC QUESTIONS**

Mr L Young spoke regarding the request from Swale Borough Council to name the new road on the site adjacent to 9 Ashford Road/Canterbury Road Orchard Walk. He commented that there was already Orchard Place in Faversham, so the name suggested would cause confusion. As alternatives Mr Young suggested Marchant and Baret.
