# 14. Minutes of the Previous Meeting

# 15. KCC Update

Cllr Thomas had spoken to Nikola Floodgate, KCC Officer, and was awaiting written details of costings for the survey, it was sked for this to be to be available at the next meeting.

It was proposed by Cllr Saunders, seconded by Cllr Hook and on being put to the meeting it was **RESOLVED** to confirm the Committee pursues a town wide scheme including, if possible, Love Lane, Oare Road and the AQMA of Ospringe Street.

Mrs Russell urged the Committee to engage with Phil Jones of PJA as his work was now guiding KCC policy. She did not want to see his work to date being unpicked.

It was proposed by Cllr Saunders, seconded by Cllr Hook and on being put to the meeting it was **RESOLVED to seek informal opinion from PJA for next steps**.

### 16. Road Review

All streets in Faversham are now likely to meet the requirement of KCC's updated policy, which was originally 24mph and is now 28mph. It was only Oare Road which was over 28mph.

### 17. <u>Funding</u>

It was agreed that once a scheme was in place, together with costings, funding would be sourced from local and national charities and organisations.

### 18.2020-2021 Budget

The Town Council's budget must be finalised by January 2020, with an informal budget workshop being held in December to discuss project and priorities.
