<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In reasonably close proximity to the community it serves?</li> </ul>	Yes – within Faversham town.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Demonstrably special to a local community and of particular local significance? (For example, because of its beauty, historic significance, recreational value, tranquillity, or richness of its wildlife.)</li> </ul>	Yes – It is a heavily wooded area that provides a green buffer, contributes to the landscape character within a largely built up area in town. This is an important space as it provides a tranquillity and richness of wildlife that is part of the longer natural corridor – for wildlife and people – that extends north eastwards towards Bysing Wood Road.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local in character and not an extensive tract of land?</li> </ul>	Yes – modest and contained.
Would designation conflict with the overall Local Plan strategy for delivering sustainable development?	Yes – the land is, and proposed to remain, allocated for residential development.
Could designation endure beyond the end of the plan period?	No – as above.
Is the land already protected by another type of designation? If so, would any additional local benefit be gained by its designation as a Local Green Space?	No current designation.
