I was a great surpporter of local shops and have, my entire life, been a great supporter of our Cinema, going at least once a week. I can no longer do this as the last bus home drops off at 9.30. A taxi to my mum, there and back can cost up to £14. I have witnessed, over the years, people in tears at the bus stop because they have missed long awaited hospital appointments. Not everyone has access to the internet and can't check for updates or changes to bus services and in my experience, Stagecoach is awful at letting people know online or on social media, when there are problems with our services. Anyone who can drive cannot begin to comprehend how difficult and stressful it is relying on these services. I would challenge our councillors to give up their cars for 1 month and use buses to get an honest sense of what it is really like. You may well be able to get to Canterbury or Maidstone from Court Street but try getting from Bysing Wood or anywhere just on the outskirts of Faversham to Court Street in the first place. The impact, since my relapse, has left me depressed and with anxiety and panic to the extent that I am now on two further medications.
