You need to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • set up a formal residents' association • hire a competent engineer or consultant to advise • hire a contractor familiar with street schemes. <p>You and the residents will have to pay all the costs. The engineer or consultant would assess and advise you on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • street layout - including footpaths, places to turn round, road width, bends, slopes, visibility, and junctions • the standards the road was built to • drainage proposals • if any pipes or cables would need to be moved by service providers • street lighting • needs of disabled road users and pedestrians • property boundaries and if any driveway changes would be required. <p>Once the road is adopted, we then own it and public notices are put up along the road.</p> <p>Developer information</p> <p>Developers can work on the existing roads and pavements as long as they meet the Section 278 legal agreement.</p>

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					<p>All Section 278 works must be designed and constructed by a consultant and a contractor who fulfil certain criteria.
