**103. BOUGHTON AND DUNKIRK NEIGHBOUHOOD PLAN**

The meeting received the request from Swale Borough Council to make a representation on the Boughton and Dunkirk Neighbourhood Plan.

The committee considered that the plan whilst having many merits did not acknowledge the modal shift to Active Travel. Members considered the importance of Active Travel Corridors between Faversham and Boughton/Dunkirk to be used by the residents of both settlements for work and leisure to ease congestion. A co-ordinated approach was needed. The

Town Council had launched the Town to Parish Project and looked forward to working with the Parish Council in the future to promote Active Travel.
