Livestock Worrying Court Result

The RTF have investigated a Livestock Worrying that was reported on 22nd April 2023, in Canterbury. This incident has had a significant effect on the farm, farm owner and farm manager both emotionally and financially.

In total 1 ewe and 27 Lambs were either killed in the attacked or had to be euthanised by attending Vets due to the severe extent of their injuries.

On the 23rd November the dog owner appeared at Folkestone Magistrates Court where he pleaded Guilty to the offence of being the person in charge of a dog worrying livestock. He was ordered to pay the victim £5000 in compensation for the damages and loss they experienced.
