29. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

It was proposed by Cllr J Rowlands, seconded by Cllr T Martin, and on being put to the meeting it was *RESOLVED to accept the Minutes of the Heritage, Buildings and Creek Committee dated 3rd July 2024.*Cllr R Crayford abstained.

30. ACTIONS AND MATTERS ARISING

32. THE GUILDHALL CLOCK

Members received two quotes for repairing and automating the Guildhall clock. The Committee considered that the information provided was not sufficient to make a decision.

34. TOWN QUAY

The Deputy Town Clerk Reported that Swale Borough Council confirmed that the contract for the transfer of Town Quay had been issued.

35. RAILWAY HERITAGE

Cllr T Martin reported that activities and talks covering Railway Heritage had been included in Open Faversham. This was the start of the process of acknowledging the railway heritage in town. There was considerable local knowledge in the area which would be drawn on. It was considered this would be a community led initiative.

Members asked to be kept informed on future discussions and developments.

36. ITEMS FOR REPORT

Mr A Thorne asked for the water quality in the creek to be added to the next agenda. A discussion as to whether this should be discussed under this committee, or the Environment Committee ensued.
