

Update on allocation of active travel reserve to 20mph compliance improvements

Introduction

At its November meeting the Committee resolved to allocate remaining earmarked reserve funds for active travel to highway improvements that will encourage compliance with the town wide 20mph speed limit.

Since the meeting initial work has gone on to develop a costed priority list of activity areas, which can be discussed with KCC officers at our annual Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) meeting, with a view to agreeing a finalised activity list that KCC will deliver during financial year 2025/26.

Setting of priorities

Potential interventions aimed at ensuring compliance with the 20mph scheme have been developed drawing on the priorities in our LCWIP and finalised HIP and our shown on the table below. Volumes have been identified after an informal site audit and costings have been identified drawing from KCC's annual HIP guide and making specific requests to the KCC Community Liaison team where necessary. Two types of intervention have been identified – those that will increase compliance with the 20mph scheme and those that will extend the scheme to additional roads within the town council area, which are not currently included.

The cost of potential interventions far outweighs the budget available and the figures quoted in the HIP guide are very much provisional, with the cost of interventions impacted by road conditions. It may also be possible to get some actions delivered by KCC as part of their standard maintenance work and some extension activities funded through developer contributions. So at this stage any decisions about which activities to fund can only be provisional, but it will be helpful if the committee can endorse the approach that is being proposed.

Provisional priorities

It is proposed to do the following:

- Prioritise activities at locations that are identified as priority areas in our HIP or LCWIP
- Prioritise activities that promote compliance with the existing 20mph scheme, over activities which extend the 20mph scheme
- Not pay for activities that will be picked up as part of planned maintenance by KCC
- Prioritise activities that seem to have the greatest potential cost benefit – for example to prioritise roundel painting/repainting over gateway stripe refreshment.

- Actively engage with KCC staff over getting road scheme markings refreshed as part of planned maintenance and getting developer contributions applied to activity which will encourage compliance.

At this stage these priorities would suggest that the majority of the £18,000 funding available would go to the compliance activities listed, excluding the repainting of gateway stripes.
