Grass Verges It is possible for parish or town councils, to take over the maintenance of highway verges in their area. If agreed, KCC would pay an annual sum for these services direct to the town council. This arrangement would only apply to urban grass cutting, shrub maintenance and urban hedge maintenance. It would allow us to manage verges and make wildlife areas to increase biodiversity.
