Crime

Abbey Ward: Nothing of note.

St. Anns Ward:

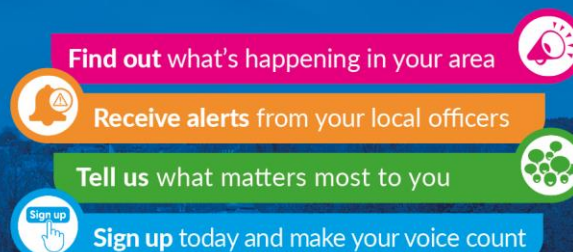
- It was reported that on Sunday 12th January a mobility scooter was stolen from the rear garden of an address in Cobb Walk. (This didn't make last months report owing to it being reported late)
- There was a fight in Whiting Crescent in the early hours of Tuesday 28th January between a group of people whom all knew each other. Nothing to concern the wider community.

Priory Ward:

- There was a report of an accosting in the High Street on Friday 31st January. This is an ongoing investigation, however the suspect has been identified and there is no wider concerns for the community.

Watling:

- On Friday 17th January, numberplates were stolen from a car on Forbes Road. If anyone has any information, please call the police via 101 and quote incident *17-0490.
- Overnight from Thursday 23rd January into Friday 24th January an industrial jet washer was stolen from the building site (Lady Dane Farm, Love Lane) worth £7,000. If anyone has any information regarding this incident, please call 101 and quote Kent police investigation 46/13454/25.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

Abbey Ward:

- Over the course of the last month a group of teenagers have periodically been running in and out of Natwest Bank causing anti-social behaviour. The local Child Centred Police officer is currently doing intervention work with them and their families.

St. Anns Ward:

- On Tuesday 14th January there was a report of three quad bikes riding around Barnes Close over grass verges and across the pavement. Nuisance vehicles such as this are an issue throughout Faversham. Local officers are collating all evidence under a problem-solving package ensuring repeat offenders are identified and ensuring all officers have access to the wider issues and not just the isolated ones they get sent to.
- On Thursday 16th January there was a report of electric bikes being ridden along the pavement in The Knole. If anyone knows names of people owning off road bikes, unregistered quad bikes, e-scooters or e-bikes in Faversham, please come along to the next police surgery and anonymously report them. Even if no offences can be evidenced, we will go and speak with these people and put them off causing these issues for the local community.
- Children were seen to throw eggs at an address in St Anns Road before running off on Friday 7th February. There are ongoing enquiries being made to try to identify them.

Priory Ward:

- On Thursday 30th January there was a report of an off-road bike being ridden on the pavement on Dark Hill. The description of the male riding the bike was that he was in his late 20's with black hair and wearing a blue and black ski jacket. If anyone has any information about the rider, please contact 101 and quote Kent police incident *30-0210.

Watling:

- On Thursday 23rd January there was a report of a child aged approximately 11 years old riding a motor bike on Tassell Place. The motorbike had no numberplate and was described as an adult motorbike. The description of the rider is a White skinned juvenile male (Approx 11 years old) with dark auburn hair and wearing an orange stripey t-shirt and glasses. The only description of the bike is that it is black in colour. If anyone has any information regarding
