

FAVERSHAM - A GREAT PLACE TO VISIT

Whether you're looking for boutique shopping, beautiful countryside and gardens or fascinating local history - the market town of Faversham is the perfect place to visit.

Famous for its picturesque buildings and historic Market Place, Faversham has been home to a thriving market for over 1,000 years. **Faversham Charter Market** trades on Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

The town boasts an impressive selection of unique shops and businesses, perfect for essential and leisure shopping. You can also enjoy a bite to eat at one of the town's excellent pubs and cafes.

The **Visitor Information Centre** at 12 Market Place has plenty of information on what to do in Faversham, including a selection of leaflets with self-guided walks around the town centre and nearby villages. For an in depth insight into Faversham's fascinating history, you can book to join a **Historic Faversham Guided Walk**, which starts from here.

Faversham has a fine selection of charters including a copy of the Magna Carta, which can be viewed for free at the **Magna Carta Exhibition** located at 12 Market Place.

NOT TO BE MISSED

A trip to Faversham isn't complete without a tour of the country's oldest brewery, **Shepherd Neame**. Following this, pop to **Creek Creative Gallery Café** and enjoy freshly prepared food surrounded by work from local artists.

Learn about Faversham's fascinating history at the **Fleur de Lis Museum**, which explores the town's colourful past and the day-to-day life of Faversham people over the centuries.

Enjoy a walk down medieval Abbey Street and along Faversham's beautiful creek, where you can visit **Standard Quay** with its antiques shops and lovely places to eat.

To keep the kids amused, visit **Faversham Pools'** heated indoor and outdoor swimming pools. The site's outdoor green spaces are the perfect spot to sunbathe and picnic after your swim.

OUT OF TOWN

With picturesque villages and stunning countryside, Faversham is the perfect place to enjoy a day trip or short break.

Here are some nearby attractions you can enjoy.

Belmont House and Gardens in Throwley is an 18th century house containing the country's finest selection of antique clocks. It's set in beautiful grounds with a pinetum, grotto, walled garden and Victorian greenhouse.

Brogdale Collections on the edge of Faversham is home to the world's largest collection of fruit trees. Explore the beautiful orchards with a guided tour.

Visit **Doddington Place** for stunning gardens including topiaries, woodland and a rock garden.

Children love **Huckleberry Woods** micro animal adventures, located just outside Faversham, with its menagerie of cute miniature animals. You can pre-book walks and experiences with pigs, alpacas, sheep and donkeys.

Macknade Food Hall on Selling Road is a must for all those who love their food and drink, with an extensive selection of produce from Kent, the UK and Europe. Allow plenty of time to enjoy something to eat at their café or outdoor food court.

Mount Ephraim at Hernhill boasts ten acres of Victorian landscaped gardens complete with a lake, bridges, rock garden and maze, overlooking Kent's beautiful orchards and farmland.

Another fabulous spot is the award-winning **Oare Gunpowder Works**. This nature reserve is packed with wildlife for visitors to enjoy whilst learning about the history of Oare's gunpowder production.

NIGHTS OUT IN FAVERSHAM

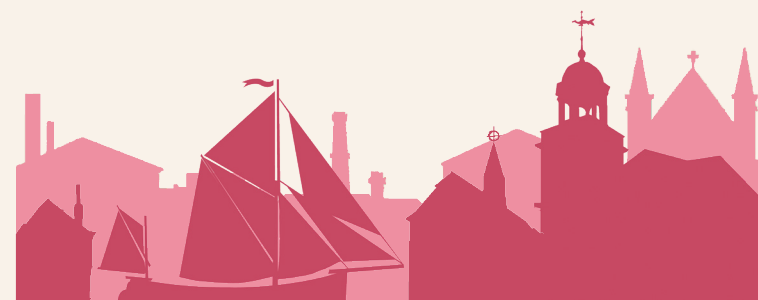

Alternatively, visitors can enjoy a film at the **Royal Cinema**, Faversham's popular independent cinema.
